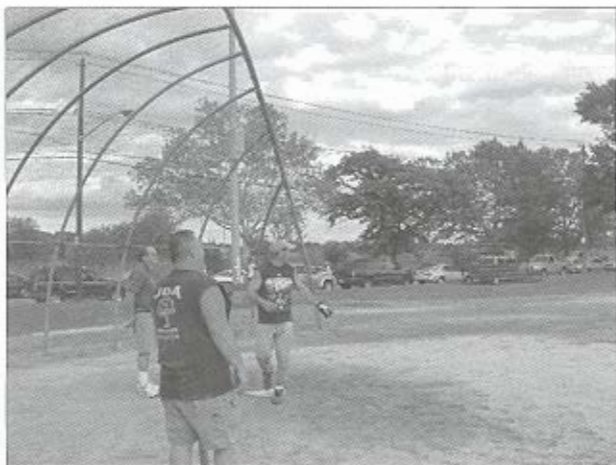

New Pension Loan Rule

Effective November 1, 2008, The New Jersey Division of Pensions and Benefits is instituting a new rule for employees who wish to apply for a pension loan. Eligible members who wish to borrow against their pension account must submit their loan request applications online using the Member Benefits Online System (MBOS).

Paper loan applications will no longer be accepted by mail, nor will you be able to fax a loan application to the pension loan office.

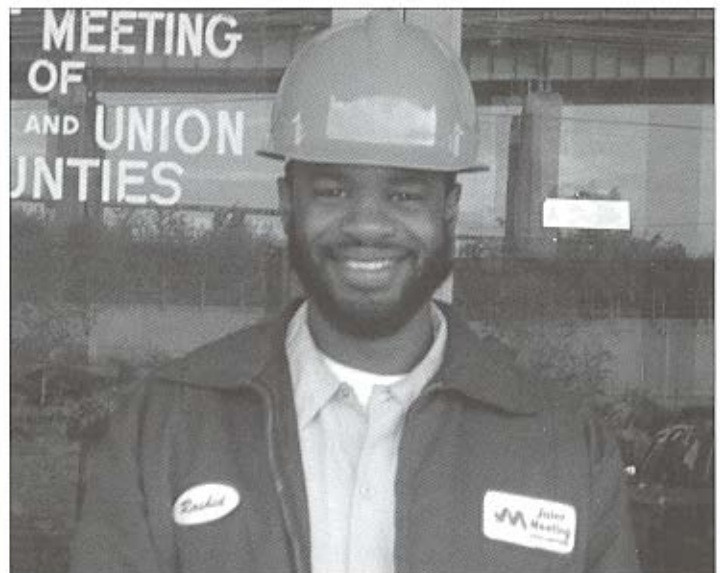
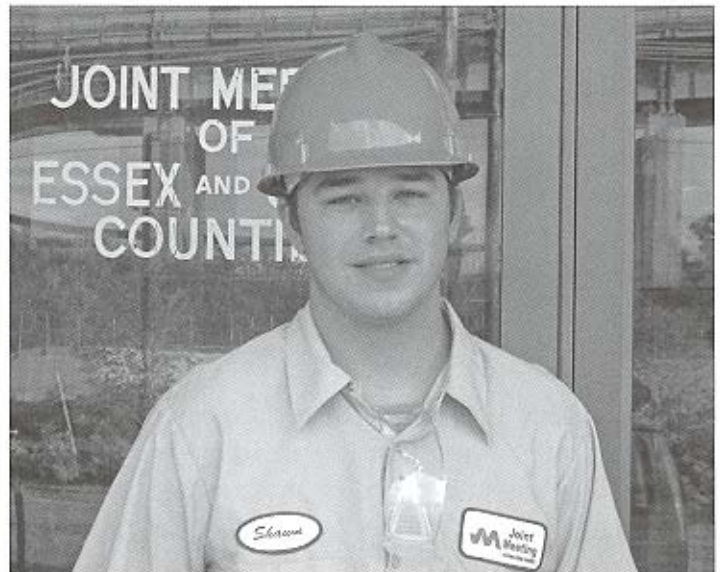
The Member Benefits Online System (MBOS) is a set of Internet applications that allow employees to access their pension account information. Members who are new to the system can access MBOS after they register with both the MyNewJersey Web site and MBOS. Registration is free. The registration process requires several steps and new users should carefully follow the MBOS Registration Instructions. If employees need assistance registering for or using MBOS, they should call the MBOS Help Desk at (609) 777-0534 or send an e-mail with the subject line "MBOS E-Mail" to: pensions.nj@treas.state.nj.us.

Members should note that limited access to a computer or a member's reluctance to use MBOS will not be considered sufficient circumstances to allow manual loan processing.

Other provisions of the pension loan program remain unchanged. Members must still have at least three years of pension service credit posted to their retirement system account. Pension contributions and credit are posted to accounts on a quarterly basis and normally take 45 days from the end of the quarter to be posted.

Members may borrow amounts from between \$50 up to one-half of the posted contributions or a maximum loan balance of \$50,000, whichever is less. The interest rate is 4.69 percent on the declining balance of the loan. There is an \$8 administrative processing fee, which is not an added fee, but is taken from the requested amount of the loan to recover the costs of administering the program.

IRS regulations require that members who have multiple loans outstanding must repay the balance of all loans within a period not to exceed five years from the issuance of the first loan taken after January 1, 2004. Loans cannot exceed 25 percent of an employee's base salary. Joint Meeting will assist employees with enrollment in the MBOS system by appointment.

Joint Meeting Earns Fifth NACWA Gold

The National Association of Clean Water Agencies (NACWA) has recognized the Joint Meeting of Essex and Union Counties by awarding the agency its Gold Award for the calendar year 2007. This is the second consecutive Gold Award that Joint Meeting has received. Joint Meeting previously won gold in 2001, 2003, 2004 and 2006.

The Gold Award is given to sewerage agencies that have met one hundred percent total compliance with the National Pollution Discharge Elimination System requirements with no violations to their New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection (NJDEP) permit.

In the past, the Joint Meeting has been recognized by NACWA with ten Silver Awards beginning in 1993. The Silver Award recognizes facilities that have had fewer than five NJDEP permit excursions in a calendar year.

Much of the success in obtaining these awards from NACWA is attributable to the great work of Joint Meeting employees in the operational and maintenance departments. Their hard work on a day-to-day basis, their cooperation and strong work ethics and their high degree of professionalism all contribute to making Joint Meeting achieve these high honors. Congratulations are extended from management to all Joint Meeting employees for their continued support and efforts.

Facility Tours of Joint Meeting
